



HOW-TO-DOCUMENT

Putting your scenes in the right order

Before you render, the order of your photos is yours to change as many times as you like, for nothing. Drag a scene, let go, and it is saved. Here is where to do it.

TIME

Under a minute

COST

Free, right up until you confirm the render

YOU'LL NEED

A computer — dragging doesn't work on a phone

1 Open the listing and click Video Rendering

It's tile four **1**, the one that says **Order the scenes and render**.

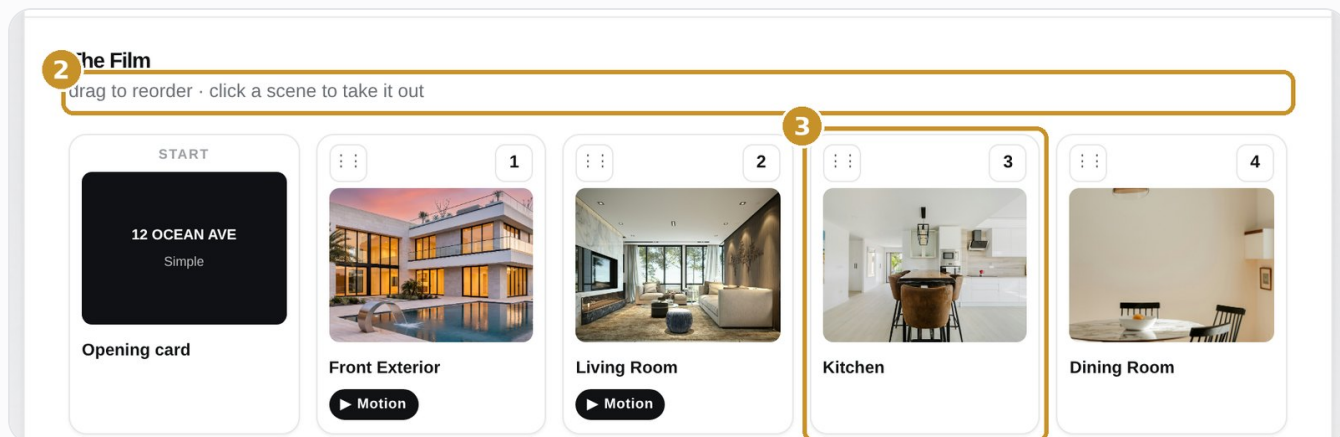

2 Look at The Film

Your photos are already laid out as scenes, left to right, in the order a buyer will watch them. The Director put them in that order when it reviewed the set. The line under the heading **2** says what you can do: **drag to reorder · click a scene to take it out**.

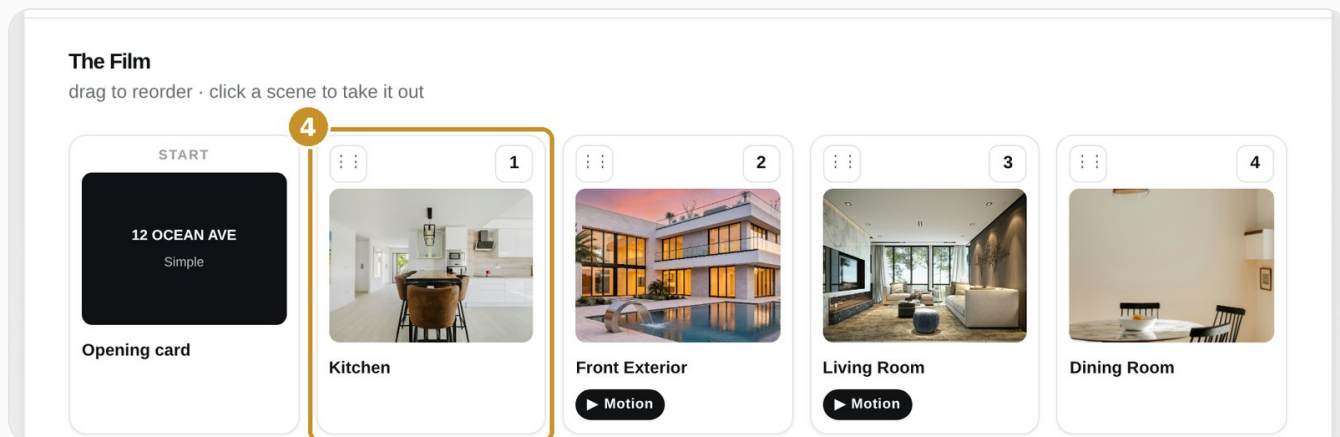
Find the photo you want to move. Here it's the kitchen **3**, sitting third.



3 Drag it where you want it

Hold the mouse button down on the photo, slide it along the strip, and let go. The other scenes step aside and renumber themselves. The kitchen is now scene one **4**.

Grab the photo itself or the grip in its top left corner. Move as many as you like.



4 That was the save

There is no button to press. The moment you let go, the new order is stored on your listing. Those numbers changing are your confirmation.

If a save ever fails you'll see a red line saying so. No red line means it went through, and it will still be that way when you come back tomorrow.

5 Tell the Director when you're happy

Type in the box **5** and say you're ready. It then asks the last few questions, the address on screen, the price, your opening and closing cards, and the music, and renders after that.

DIRECTOR

I've picked the order for your photos, laid out below. Drag any photo to a new spot to reorder the scenes, or click one and choose Remove from video at the bottom of the panel to take it out of the film entirely. When you're happy with the lineup, say the word and I'll ask the last few questions: the address on screen, the price, your opening and closing cards, and the music. Then I render.

6 Nothing is charged until you confirm

Reordering is free and unlimited right up to that point. Credits come off when you say yes to the render, not before.

Worth thirty seconds now. Once a video has rendered, changing the order means re-rendering it, which costs 18 credits for a 16:9 video. Getting the lineup right here is the cheapest it will ever be.

Worth knowing

The order you start from is a walkthrough, on purpose

Front exterior, entry, main living space, kitchen, dining, the primary bedroom and then its bathroom, other bedrooms, other bathrooms, flex rooms, outdoor living, and a closing exterior. That is the sequence buyers expect, which is why the Director reaches for it. Move whatever you like, but that is the reasoning behind where it starts.

Motion Selection lets you drag too

Step 3 has the same strip and the same drag, even though the page doesn't mention it. There is only one order, so whichever page you change it on, it's the same change.

Listing Pictures is not where the order lives

Step 1 is where photos come in. That grid is the order you uploaded them in, not the order they appear in the video.

Use a computer, not your phone

Dragging a scene needs a mouse or a trackpad. The rest of the page works fine on a phone; the reorder doesn't.

Taking a photo out is a different thing

Click a scene and choose **Remove from video** and the photo leaves the listing, not just the film. A video needs at least four scenes, so you cannot go below that.

Once the render starts, the strip locks

The hint changes to "Scenes are locked in, this video is in production" and the grips disappear. From then on, changing the order means an edit and a re-render.

Still stuck? Open the chat bubble in the bottom corner of any page and ask. A person can pick up that conversation if the assistant can't sort it out.
